The Vicar carries the bowl of water and towel and goes into the nave. There he washes the hands of twelve people — during which is sung:: ANTHEM Ubi Caritas et amor, Ubi caritas, Deus ibi est Duruflé [Where there is charity and love, God is in the midst] The washing ends with this collect:: Almighty Father, whose Son Jesus Christ has taught us that what we do for the least of our brethren we do also for him: give us the will to be the servant of others as he was the servant of all, who gave up his life and died for us, yet is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. ΑII Amen. Kneel INTERCESSIONS begin with all singing: or sit Jesus, remember me, Taizé when you come into your kingdom; Jesus, remember me, when you come into your kingdom. - repeated after each petition. Most merciful Lord, ΑII your love compels us to come in. Our hands were unclean, our hearts were unprepared; we were not fit even to eat the crumbs from under your table.
