Sit Sermon by the Bishop

Liturgy of Initiation

During a short organ interlude, **the congregation stands and turns to the font** to which the Bishop processes with all the candidates for baptism and confirmation together with their presenting ministers

The presenting minister says

I present N to be baptised.

Bishop N, do you wish to be baptized?

Candidate I do.

The presenting ministers of those already baptised say in turn I present N to be confirmed.

The Bishop addresses all of those already baptised.

Have you been baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit?

Candidates I have.

Are you ready with your own mouth and from your own heart to affirm your faith in Jesus Christ?

Candidates I am.

The Bishop addresses the whole congregation

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome these candidates and uphold them in their life in Christ?

All With the help of God, we will.

The Decision

The Bishop addresses all the candidates

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask:

Do you turn to Christ? I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins? I repent of my sins.

Do you renounce evil? I renounce evil.

Signing with the Cross

The Bishop makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each candidate for baptism, saying

Christ claims you for his own.

Receive the sign of his cross.

Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

All Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.**

Prayer over the Water

Amen.

Bishop Praise God who made heaven and earth, who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life. We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son, we baptize into his fellowship those who come to him in faith. Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, they may be cleansed from sin and born again. Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

Profession of Faith

The Bishop addresses the congregation

Brothers and sisters,

I ask you to profess together with these candidates

the faith of the Church.

Bishop Do you believe and trust in God the Father,

source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist

All I believe and trust in him

Do you believe and trust in God the Son,

who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

All I believe and trust in him

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world?

All I believe and trust in him

This is the faith of the Church

This is our faith.

We believe and trust in one God,

Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Baptism

Bishop N, I baptize you

in the name of the Father,

and of the Son,

and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

The Bishop prays for the candidates

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church,

pour upon you the riches of his grace,

that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit,

and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory.

All Amen.

Motet

During the motet, the Bishop leads the candidates to the place of confirmation at the front of the nave.

The congregation sits

Confirmation

The Bishop stands before those who are to be confirmed, and says

Our help is in the name of the Lord

All who has made heaven and earth.

Blessed be the name of the Lord

All now and for ever. Amen.

The Bishop extends his hands towards those to be confirmed and says

Almighty and ever-living God,

you have given these your servants new birth

in baptism by water and the Spirit,

and have forgiven them all their sins.

Let your Holy Spirit rest upon them:

the Spirit of wisdom and understanding;

the Spirit of counsel and inward strength;

the Spirit of knowledge and true godliness;

and let their delight be in the fear of the Lord.

All Amen.

The presenting minister announces each candidate in turn who then stands before the Bishop

Bishop N, God has called you by name and made you his own.

The candidate then moves towards the Bishop who lays his hands on the head of the candidate, saying

Confirm, O Lord, your servant with your Holy Spirit.

All Amen.

The Bishop then signs the forehead of the candidate with the oil of Chrism, saying Receive the seal of the Spirit.

All Amen.

After all have been confirmed, the Bishop invites the congregation to pray for all those on whom hands have been laid

All Defend, O Lord, these your servants with your heavenly grace, that they may continue yours for ever, and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more until they come to your everlasting kingdom. Amen.

Liturgy of the Eucharist

The congregation stands

The Peace

Bishop God has made us one in Christ.

He has set his seal upon us, and as a pledge of what is to come has given us the Spirit to dwell in our hearts.

The peace of the Lord be always with you

All and also with you.

All may greet one another in peace.

Hymn 445 Christians, lift up your hearts

During which bread and wine is presented and a collection is received

The Eucharistic Prayer

Bishop The Lord is here.

His Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Father, we give you thanks and praise through your beloved Son Jesus Christ, your living Word, through whom you have created all things; who was sent by you in your great goodness to be our Saviour.

By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh; as your Son, born of the blessed Virgin, he lived on earth and went about among us;

he opened wide his arms for us on the cross; he put an end to death by dying for us; and revealed the resurrection by rising to new life; so he fulfilled your will and won for you a holy people.

And now we give you thanks because by water and the Holy Spirit you have made us a holy people in Jesus Christ our Lord, you raise us to new life in him and renew in us the image of your glory.

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and singing:

Choir

Holy, holy, holy Lord ... Hosanna in the highest.

Kneel or sit

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ; who in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying:
Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Great is the mystery of faith

All Christ has died:

Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through him from whom all good things come, Jesus Christ our Lord;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

Amen.
