ORGAN RECITAL by Roxanne Summerfield **at Leicester Cathedral at Ipm on Monday 31 March**, donations welcomed. Lunch is available to buy from 12.30.

MOTHERING SUNDAY has its origins in a phrase from the Epistle appointed to be read in the Book of Common Prayer on the Fourth Sunday in Lent: "Jerusalem ...which is the mother of us all." *Galatians 4.26* In previous centuries, a high proportion of the working population was in domestic service living in the houses of their employers. On Mothering Sunday servants would have the day off to return home and spend the day with their mothers. Spring flowers would be gathered along the way as gifts.

MOTHER CHURCH "...the Anglican Church is a tolerant, faintly detached and amused mother of lazy permissive standards but she is a real mother nevertheless. She does not hector and bully her children. She expects them to be mature and independent. There are certain house rules she likes observed in her home – a sort of minimal but important standard – but if her children break it she doesn't go into an operatic tantrum.
