The Community of Grace on Gwendolen Road recently appealed for our support in objecting to proposed extension of

hours to the operation of *The Venue* opposite. Our response contributed the proposed extension of hours being denied. The Venue is now attempting again to gain extension.

The Community of Grace is a refuge for people who have been grievously traumatised and have lost hope. They aim to create an atmosphere of acceptance, warmth and a good degree of serenity, so as to help residents return to a life which brings them some fulfilment. Disturbance taking place late at night – and into the early hours – seriously undermines our efforts,
