WOMEN'S WORLD DAY OF PRAYER is on Friday 6 March. Services are taking place this year at Stoneygate Baptist Church – 2pm and at Clarendon Park Congregational Church – 7.30pm. Everyone welcome – including men!

THURSDAYS AT ST JAMES following the morning Eucharist and Coffee Drop-In, once a month we invite people to join us for activities and friendship, concluding with lunch. A £2 donation is suggested to cover the cost of the food – all extra proceeds this month will be donated to the Saturday Stop-By project, providing hot meals for those in need. The next date will be 12 March. Everybody welcome but please pre-book by calling the Church Office on 0116 254 2111 or signing the form at the back of church.

A CRÈCHE ROOM (the Servers' Vestry) is available where babies and toddlers can be taken if they become fractious during services. There is a changing mat, a play mat and a Noah's ark to play with. A sound link with the service in Church is provided. *Please ask a Churchwarden or Sidesman for further details.*

A SPECIAL POSTER for Lent in the entrance porch is taken from original artwork by Sarah Kirby. It suggests a wilderness landscape in purplish hues. A panel of text derives from verses in the Bible woven into the choir anthem 'Blessed be the God and Father'. Phases of the moon indicate the length of Lent – the poster's caption FORTY DAYS & FORTY NIGHTS. Do take a close look.

THE SIXTEEN – the world famous choral ensemble with their internationally acclaimed conductor Harry Christophers – are coming again to St James the Greater on Thursday, 28 May 2015 at 7.30 pm. The programme is entitled 'Flight of angels' – including music by Francisco Guerrero and Alonso Lobo, two Spanish composers of the
