GIVE & ENJOY! FUNDING RENEWAL UPDATE

We have sent out 407 Appeal letters to individuals and families known to St James. This includes 197 who are current donors and / or regular congregation. The job of following up these 197 is about to commence. However, 23 have already responded. Renewed pledges for regular giving (either through bank standing orders or the Envelope scheme) total £15,780 per annum to date. This represents an increase of 21% on the previous level of giving. Some people prefer to make a single (usually annual) donation instead of a monthly commitment. So far we have received £7,650 in single donations. All figures include Gift Aid. It is still very early to judge the success of the Funding Programme – but so far so good.
