GIVE & ENJOY! FUNDING RENEWAL UPDATE

So far we have received a total of 44 responses to the Vicar's letter, out of 197 sent to existing donors / regular congregation and a further 210 sent to the wider database of known supporters. Pledges to date for regular giving total £27,192 per annum, an increase of 26% on a comparative basis. A further £10,212 has been donated by those who prefer to make a single donation instead of a weekly or monthly commitment. All figures include Gift Aid. Progress is satisfactory and we hope to complete the follow-up contact within the next three weeks. John Sharp
