

GIVE & ENJOY! FUNDING RENEWAL UPDATE

The Vicar's letter and accompanying literature was sent to 205 individuals or families who are considered as either current donors or regular congregation – "the flock". Also 102 letters were sent to those who have had a connection with St James the Greater in the past or who come infrequently to Church, on special occasions – "the fringe". In addition, 104 letters were sent to those who have been very supportive by attendance at concerts only.

So far, we have had responses from just over half of the Flock and our team are following-up on the others as soon as possible (several are on holiday).

The total of Regular Giving pledged to date is £61,457 per annum, which on a comparable basis represents a 22% increase. The total of Single Donations received so far is £13,193 – all figures including Gift Aid.

We are anticipating a positive response from at least a further 48 people so we can be cautiously optimistic that the target will be reached.
