# CAIN AND ABEL – a sculpture by David H Clark – is a temporary exhibit in the north aisle.

This work is based on the story of fratricide – Cain killing Abel – in the first book in the Bible: Genesis, chapter 4. David has chosen to represent this archetypal murder as Jihadi John killing Salford taxi driver Alan Henning – the innocent voluntary aid worker who was kidnapped in Ad Dana, an area held by Daesh (ISIS or ISIL). Alan was beheaded by Jihadi John (Mohammed Emwazi) on 3 October 2014.

The oaken pillar with the inscriptions is part of an old litany desk. 'Thou shalt not kill' is the sixth (VI) commandment, verse 13 in the Book of Exodus chapter 20. The other texts on the chamfered 'legs' are taken from chapter 4 of the book of Genesis. After the killing, God asks, 'What have you done?' Cain's truculent answer is, 'Am I my brother's keeper?' The inscription on the other side contains the further words of God to Cain after the murder: 'Thy brother's blood crieth unto me from the ground'.

A fuller description of the work is adjacent to the sculpture
