18.30 **Evensong** Officiant: Canon Glynn Richerby Preacher: The Reverend David Clark THEO SAUNDERS – Director of Music at St James the Greater for 11 years (1991-2002) – died last Tuesday, 12 January, aged 58 following a long illness.

Theo's post at St James's was held jointly with Stoneygate School – whose premises were then nearby on the London Road – where he was Head of Music. Although not a formal 'choir school', Theo aimed to recruit half of the church's boy choristers from among the pupils.



As well as being a distinguished musician, Theo had a deep appreciation of liturgy and was highly co operative with the Vicar in devising special services. Examples of this continuing legacy are the Epiphany Carol Service – as held last Sunday – and the Candlemas Service to be held at the end of the month.

Theo left St James's to be Organist and Master of the Choristers at Armagh Cathedral, from where he took early retirement through ill health early last year. The Archbishop of Armagh wrote "Over the past decade, Theo has served the music and the worship of the Cathedral with immense dedication and musical skill".

Theo will be fondly remembered by all who knew him as a good and godly man.
