

# Jesus : *"Who do people say I am?"*

Jesus asked his first disciples the question: "Who do people say I am?" They answer, in effect, "some say *this* and some say *that*". "But you" – Jesus asks searchingly – "who do **you** say I am?"

**On Sunday mornings in Lent at the 10.30 service**, our team of Readers (lay preachers) are going to take turns in attempting to answer Jesus' question by taking a fresh look at titles attributed to him, viewed in the light of contemporary understanding. This series will provide revealing aspects of what it means to regard Jesus as *Messiah* – the theme of Sunday evenings in Lent ...

# COME & SING *MESSIAH* on Sunday evenings in Lent

'Come and sing *Messiah*' has been a popular development in recent years – usually a rehearsal for the inside of a day followed by a scratch performance – in the spirit of this being the music and devotion of the people.

There has been a custom at St James's for some years now of the Hallelujah Chorus being sung as part of our Easter morning service – with members of the congregation joining the choir for an exuberant rendering. This opportunity is being extended from Lent until Easter for everyone who wishes to join our choirs to sing one chorus at a time. These are from parts two and three of Messiah with their themes of the Passion and resurrection of Christ.

It will be good to give sustained attention to *Messiah*. This will continue the series that began in Advent. It concludes on the evening of Easter Day with a superb solo rendering of 'The Trumpet Shall Sound' and a full general chorus of 'Worthy is the Lamb'.

**REHEARSAL for each Sunday is from 5.30 until 6.00 pm in the church.** This is followed by a cup of tea in the Hall before the service of Evensong.

Rehearsed singers will then join the choir for a chorus to be sung in the service, following a talk given by the Vicar on the significance of the words.
