

BREXIT FALLOUT Far from resolving simmering divisions, the referendum has brought them all to the boil. It is apparent at every level of our society that the result so far is to accentuate differences of opinion.

More troubling is the personal abuse with name calling and insults and a new pretext provided for hateful attitudes towards immigrants.

In this situation, Christians have a vital role to play in promoting reconciliation. Justin Welby – the Archbishop of Canterbury – has written:

"Reconciliation doesn't mean we all agree. It means we find ways of disagreeing – perhaps very passionately – but loving each other deeply at the same time, and being deeply committed to each other. That's the challenge for the church if we are actually going to speak to our society, which is increasingly divided in many different ways."


The cost is $\pounds 10$, which includes travel and a cooked lunch, dessert and drink or a selection of lighter choices.
