STEPHEN MOORE has been appointed Director of Music at Llandaff Cathedral.

His musical career began at St James the Greater – as a chorister, Organ Scholar and at the age of 17 succeeding his brother Tom as Assistant Organist . (Tom has since gone on to be Director of Music at Wakefield Cathedral). After a gap year as Organ Scholar at Southwell Minster, Stephen studied at Trinity College of Music, London, graduating in 2008 with a first class degree in performance and winning the medal for the highest mark in keyboard studies in his year and the college prize for conducting. Stephen then spent a year as Organ Scholar at Salisbury Cathedral before taking up the post of Organist and

Director of Choral Music at Felsted School, Essex, as well as Musical Director of the Braintree Choral Society. Since 2010 Stephen has been Director of Music at St Matthew's, Northampton, redeveloping and consolidating the choral tradition. The Dean of Llandaff says: "I am delighted that Stephen has accepted the invitation to join us at Llandaff. He brings with him a wealth of experience and an energetic vision that will reshape the delivery of music here".

We bask in reflected glory! Stephen takes up his new appointment in September.
