LENT AT ST. JAMES Start Lent with intent this year on Ash Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> February at 7.30 pm with the Choral Eucharist and Imposition of Ashes. Compline on Wednesdays at 6.30 pm in Lent will be sung by the choir. Evensong at 6 pm in Lent will include a special sermon series exploring how we can be a more inclusive church. After each service there will be refreshments and a chance to discuss the sermon with the guest preacher. Please note that in order to facilitate this, each evening service will begin half an hour early at 6 pm throughout March.

**HOUSE GROUPS** This Lent we aim to launch house groups. You will find sign-up sheets at the back of church arranged into four groups - there are spaces to indicate if you can host or simply wish to attend. Materials for discussion will be provided.
