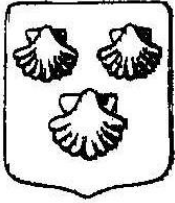
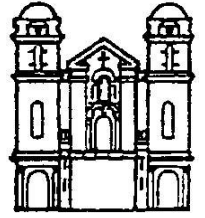

The Word of God

Jeremiah 31. 31 – 34

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with

the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, 'Know the Lord', for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour.

'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say — "Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name.' And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.' He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

The Vicar Writes ...

Two months ago we heard about Philip being called by Jesus, and in turn inviting Nathanael to "come and see" Jesus. Now, towards the end of Lent, we hear Philip still acting as this conduit, but by now strangers are coming to him asking to see Jesus.



Yet Jesus offers words of warning – that what they seek will be hidden, like a seed in the earth, or not where they expect – lifted up in suffering. Perhaps more than ever we have experienced this hiddenness of God this past year, but perhaps, through the suffering, we can also find him in places we do not expect.

National Day of Remembrance

This coming Tuesday, 23rd March, marks one year since the first UK lockdown. Since then, many people have been bereaved, both as a result of Covid-19 and other causes. The restrictions we've all been living under have meant that many people have had to grieve without the comfort of having friends and family around them.

Marie Curie, a charity which supports people around the event of a terminal diagnosis, has organised a National Day of Reflection to acknowledge grief and loss over the last year. The Church of England is one of several organisations across the UK who are supporting it. There will be a minute's silence at 12:00 pm on Tuesday to create a moment that shows support for the millions of people who've been bereaved.

Special prayers have also been written to commemorate the day, that you may wish to include as part of your daily prayers.

Leicester Cathedral will be hosting a Memorial of Lament, a live-streamed service on Tuesday evening. Words, music and reflections, including contributions from the Lord-Lieutenant, leaders in public health, the police, volunteers, NHS staff and the bereaved with the Dean, Canons and Choir of the Cathedral. During the ceremony one candle will be lit for every life lost to Covid-19 in Leicester and Leicestershire. The service will be available to watch on the Cathedral's YouTube channel from 7:00pm onwards.

MAUNDY THURSDAY DIOCESAN EUCHARIST On 1st April, clergy and lay ministers of the diocese would usually gather in Leicester Cathedral for the Diocesan (Chrism) Eucharist, with the renewal of ordination vows and blessing of the oils. Unfortunately, due to the continuing high numbers of COVID cases in Leicestershire, the difficult decision has been made to move the service online for a second year.

The Bishops and those with other key roles to play in the service will be in the Cathedral and the service will be livestreamed through the Cathedral's YouTube and Facebook page at 11:00am, and also available to watch later. Bishop Martyn will preside and the preacher will be The Rt Revd Rob Freeman, one of our Honorary Assistant Bishops. You'll be able to download the order of service from the diocesan website from 29th March onwards.

LEICESTERSHIRE AT THE CROSS 2021 On Good Friday, many churches and denominations from around Leicestershire, along with the Bishop of Leicester, are coming together for 'Leicestershire at the Cross'. This will be an amazing event, with many people involved. We are invited to come and enjoy powerful music, words and performances, as we celebrate and remember the cross of Jesus Christ. Everyone is welcome to join, as we celebrate Jesus as a county this Good Friday. The event will be streamed on the **Praying for Leicestershire YouTube channel** on Friday 2nd April (streaming from 5.45pm, with the event beginning at 6pm).

LENT APPEAL At the start of Lent, we launched our Lent Appeal for 2021. In most years, we would usually support the Bishop's Lent Appeal. However, this year with churches in Leicester and Leicestershire unable to open, an appeal isn't being held. Because of this, we'd like to encourage you to take this opportunity to help a charity of your choice.

YOUR GIVING TO ST JAMES Did you know that in a normal year over 35% of the church's income is made up of regular Direct Debits and Standing Orders from members of the congregation?

If you already give by Direct Debit or Standing Order, thank you! Of course, if you are able to increase the amount you give, that would be very welcome. We do not hold Gift Aid declarations for some people and if this applies to you, we will be in touch to ask if you can fill one in for us.

If you are not already a regular giver, please consider starting a Direct Debit through the Church of England's Parish Giving Scheme. They offer a very friendly service and will help you set everything up over the phone. They make sure that Gift Aid tax relief is claimed (this adds 25p to every £1 that you give), and they pass every penny of your donation straight through to St James the Greater.

DAILY HOPE TELEPHONE SERVICE offers music, prayers and reflections as well as full worship services from the Church of England at the end of a telephone line. The line – which is available 24 hours a day on 0800 804 8044 – has been set up particularly with those unable to join online church services during the period of restrictions in mind. This is a Freephone number.

Options available include materials also available digitally by the Church of England's Communications team such as Prayer during the Day and Night Prayer updated daily, from Common Worship, and a recording of the Church of England weekly national online service. A section called Hymn Line offers callers a selection of hymns, updated daily. An option entitled 'Hymns We Love', provides an increasing range of hymns and reflections on them. More options have been added.

The options are detailed below:

1. Hymns we love – one each day with a spoken reflection based on it.
2. Hymn line – favourite hymns on a repeating loop.
3. Chair exercises – a different set of exercise for each day of the week.
4. Daily Reflection for these times – read by Pam Rhodes.
5. Access to more options (6 – 9).
6. Weekly service from C of E.
7. Morning and Evening Prayer from Common Worship.
8. Latest Government advice on Coronavirus.
9. Mother's Union Midday Service.

Pressing 0 returns you to the top menu (1 – 5) and * gives access to the full text of the Archbishop of Canterbury's introduction. It is helpful to have the telephone on speakerphone to avoid having to hold the handset for a long time.
