

The Vicar Writes ...

Holy week is always one of the great imaginative exercises of our faith. We meet crowds, cheering today, jeering on Friday, we see justice and friendship betrayed, rejoicing and heartbreak, the washing of feet and the breaking of bread.

This year that imaginative exercise is perhaps harder, without our processions and palms, with no hymns, no bread and wine shared. Yet in the heartbreak so many have endured this year, perhaps God is closer to us than ever, if we can find the way to recognize him.



FELLOW CITIZENS OF HEAVEN Did you know that during his time as our Vicar at St James the Greater and then as Provost of Leicester, Derek Hole has delivered the address at over 200 funerals. Working in collaboration with Graham Jagger, Derek has collated fifty of these addresses into a newly published book, 'Fellow Citizens of Heaven'.

The book is published by the Friends of St James the Greater and is available to buy online from lulu.com. Holy Week Services

As we're unable to open for services this Holy Week and Easter all our services will be online. Below you'll find details of services and devotional music that we will be offering, as well as our regular Wednesday evening service of Compline.

MAUNDY THURSDAY At 7:30pm the Vicar will lead an online service as we commemorate the Last Supper and mark the beginning of the Easter Triduum. If you were with us at the start of Lent for our Ash Wednesday, this service will follow a similar format. The full order of service and Zoom details for the service will be emailed out to everyone who receives the bulletin on Thursday.

GOOD FRIDAY Paul Jenkins and the Knighton String Quartet will be performing 'Seven Last Words', a meditation on Good Friday in words and the music of Joseph Haydn. Their performance will be recorded in church on Good Friday and be available to watch on our Facebook page and YouTube channel later in the day.

EASTER SUNDAY We will celebrate the end of Lent and the resurrection of Jesus with online worship at 10:30am. Full details of our service will be in next week's bulletin.

In addition to our services, there are other online events being hosted in Leicester during Holy Week, these include:

HOLY WEEK TOGETHER: A CRY FROM THE CROSS Each day from Palm Sunday to Holy Saturday, the Cathedral will publish (on their social media and website) a meditation available from 12 noon. These films include bible readings, music, poetry and prayers. Bishop Guli will reflect each day on Jesus's last words from the cross using her experience as a Christian from Iran but who

now lives here. Dean David will conclude the films on Holy Saturday with a reflection on all that Bishop Guli has explored. They are offered as a resource for reflection this Holy Week as we journey again with Jesus.

MAUNDY THURSDAY DIOCESAN EUCHARIST On 1st April, clergy and lay ministers of the diocese would usually gather in Leicester Cathedral for the Diocesan (Chrism) Eucharist, with the renewal of ordination vows and blessing of the oils. Unfortunately, due to the continuing high numbers of COVID cases in Leicestershire, the difficult decision has been made to move the service online for a second year.

The Bishops and those with other key roles to play in the service will be in the Cathedral and the service will be livestreamed through the Cathedral's YouTube and Facebook page at 11:00am, and also available to watch later. Bishop Martyn will preside and the preacher will be The Rt Revd Rob Freeman, one of our Honorary Assistant Bishops. You'll be able to download the order of service from the diocesan website from 29th March onwards.

LEICESTERSHIRE AT THE CROSS 2021 On Good Friday, many churches and denominations from around Leicestershire, along with the Bishop of Leicester, are coming together for 'Leicestershire at the Cross'. This will be an amazing event, with many people involved. We are invited to come and enjoy powerful music, words and performances, as we celebrate and remember the cross of Jesus Christ. Everyone is welcome to join, as we celebrate Jesus as a county this Good Friday. The event will be streamed on the **Praying for Leicestershire YouTube channel** on Friday 2nd April (streaming from 5.45pm, with the event beginning at 6pm).

LENT APPEAL At the start of Lent, we launched our Lent Appeal for 2021. In most years, we would usually support the Bishop's Lent Appeal. However, this year with churches in Leicester and Leicestershire unable to open, an appeal isn't being held. Because of this, we'd like to encourage you to take this opportunity to help a charity of your choice.

We know many of you already support charities both locally, nationally and abroad. However, if you're unsure of a charity to back, or would like to help a different one, maybe you'd like to consider making a donation to one of the fantastic organisations listed below. YOUR GIVING TO ST JAMES Did you know that in a normal year over 35% of the church's income is made up of regular Direct Debits and Standing Orders from members of the congregation?

If you already give by Direct Debit or Standing Order, thank you! Of course, if you are able to increase the amount you give, that would be very welcome. We do not hold Gift Aid declarations for some people and if this applies to you, we will be in touch to ask if you can fill one in for us.

If you are not already a regular giver, please consider starting a Direct Debit through the Church of England's Parish Giving Scheme. They offer a very friendly service and will help you set everything up over the phone. They make sure that Gift Aid tax relief is claimed (this adds 25p to every £1 that you give), and they pass every penny of your donation straight through to St James the Greater.

DAILY HOPE TELEPHONE SERVICE offers music, prayers and reflections as well as full worship services from the Church of England at the end of a telephone line. The line – which is available 24 hours a day on 0800 804 8044 –

has been set up particularly with those unable to join online church services during the period of restrictions in mind. This is a Freephone number.

Options available include materials also available digitally by the Church of England's Communications team such as Prayer during the Day and Night Prayer updated daily, from Common Worship, and a recording of the Church of England weekly national online service. A section called Hymn Line offers callers a selection of hymns, updated daily. An option entitled 'Hymns We Love', provides an increasing range of hymns and reflections on them. More options have been added.

The options are detailed below:

1. Hymns we love – one each day with a spoken reflection based on it.
2. Hymn line – favourite hymns on a repeating loop.
3. Chair exercises – a different set of exercise for each day of the week.
4. Daily Reflection for these times – read by Pam Rhodes.
5. Access to more options (6 – 9).
6. Weekly service from C of E.
7. Morning and Evening Prayer from Common Worship.
8. Latest Government advice on Coronavirus.
9. Mother's Union Midday Service.

Pressing 0 returns you to the top menu (1 – 5) and * gives access to the full text of the Archbishop of Canterbury's introduction. It is helpful to have the telephone on speakerphone to avoid having to hold the handset for a long time.
