READING Exodus 20.1-17 read by Vicky Roe Then God spoke all these words:

- <sup>2</sup> I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; <sup>3</sup>you shall have no other gods before me.
- <sup>4</sup> You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is on the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. <sup>5</sup>You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I the LORD your God am a jealous God, punishing children for the iniquity of parents, to the third and the fourth generation of those who reject me, <sup>6</sup>but showing steadfast love to the thousandth generation of those who love me and keep my commandments.
- <sup>7</sup> You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not acquit anyone who misuses his name.
- <sup>8</sup> Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. <sup>9</sup>For six days you shall labour and do all your work. <sup>10</sup>But the seventh day is a sabbath to the LORD your God; you shall not do any work—you, your son or your daughter, your male or female slave, your livestock, or the alien resident in your towns. <sup>11</sup>For in six days

the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day and consecrated it.

- <sup>12</sup> Honour your father and your mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the LORD your God is giving you.
- 13 You shall not murder.
- <sup>14</sup> You shall not commit adultery.
- 15 You shall not steal.
- <sup>16</sup> You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour.
- <sup>17</sup> You shall not covet your neighbour's house; you shall not covet your neighbour's wife, or male or female slave, or ox, or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbour.

GOSPEL John 2.13-22

The Passover of the Jews was near, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. <sup>14</sup>In the temple he found people selling cattle, sheep, and doves, and the money-changers seated at their tables. <sup>15</sup>Making a whip of cords, he drove all of them out of the temple, both the sheep and the cattle. He also poured out the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables. <sup>16</sup>He told those who were selling the doves, 'Take these things out of here! Stop making my Father's house a market-place!' <sup>17</sup>His disciples remembered that it was written, 'Zeal for your house will consume me.' <sup>18</sup>The Jews then said to him, 'What sign can you show us for doing this?' <sup>19</sup>Jesus answered them, 'Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up.' <sup>20</sup>The Jews then said, 'This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and will you raise it up in three days?' <sup>21</sup>But he was speaking of the temple of his body. <sup>22</sup>After he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this; and they believed the scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.

FIRST LESSON Exodus 5.1-6.1 read by Caroline Beardsmore

Afterwards Moses and Aaron went to Pharaoh and said, 'Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, "Let my people go, so that they may celebrate a festival to me in the wilderness." 'But Pharaoh said, 'Who is the LORD, that I should heed him and let Israel go? I do not know the LORD, and I will not let Israel go.' Then they said, 'The God of the Hebrews has revealed himself to us; let us go a three days' journey into the wilderness to sacrifice to the LORD our God, or he will fall upon us with pestilence or sword.' But the king of Egypt said to them, 'Moses and Aaron, why are you taking the people away from their work? Get to your labours!' <sup>5</sup>Pharaoh continued, 'Now they are more numerous than the people of the land and yet you want them to stop working!' <sup>6</sup>That same day Pharaoh

commanded the taskmasters of the people, as well as their supervisors, <sup>7</sup>'You shall no longer give the people straw to make bricks, as before; let them go and gather straw for themselves. <sup>8</sup>But you shall require of them the same quantity of bricks as they have made previously; do not diminish it, for they are lazy; that is why they cry, "Let us go and offer sacrifice to our God." <sup>9</sup>Let heavier work be laid on them; then they will labour at it and pay no attention to deceptive words."

- <sup>10</sup> So the taskmasters and the supervisors of the people went out and said to the people, 'Thus says Pharaoh, "I will not give you straw. <sup>11</sup>Go and get straw yourselves, wherever you can find it; but your work will not be lessened in the least." ' <sup>12</sup>So the people scattered throughout the land of Egypt, to gather stubble for straw. <sup>13</sup>The taskmasters were urgent, saying, 'Complete your work, the same daily assignment as when you were given straw.' <sup>14</sup>And the supervisors of the Israelites, whom Pharaoh's taskmasters had set over them, were beaten, and were asked, 'Why did you not finish the required quantity of bricks yesterday and today, as you did before?'
- Then the Israelite supervisors came to Pharaoh and cried, 'Why do you treat your servants like this? <sup>16</sup>No straw is given to your servants, yet they say to us, "Make bricks!" Look how your servants are beaten! You are unjust to your own people.' <sup>17</sup>He said, 'You are lazy, lazy; that is why you say, "Let us go and sacrifice to the LORD." <sup>18</sup>Go now, and work; for no straw shall be given you, but you shall still deliver the same number of bricks.' <sup>19</sup>The Israelite supervisors saw that they were in trouble when they were told, 'You shall not lessen your daily number of bricks.' <sup>20</sup>As they left Pharaoh, they came upon Moses and Aaron who were waiting to meet them. <sup>21</sup>They said to them, 'The LORD look upon you and judge! You have brought us into bad odour with Pharaoh and his officials, and have put a sword in their hand to kill us.'
- <sup>22</sup> Then Moses turned again to the LORD and said, 'O LORD, why have you mistreated this people? Why did you ever send me? <sup>23</sup>Since I first came to Pharaoh to speak in your name, he has mistreated this people, and you have done nothing at all to deliver your people.'
- 6Then the LORD said to Moses, 'Now you shall see what I will do to Pharaoh: Indeed, by a mighty hand he will let them go; by a mighty hand he will drive them out of his land.'

SECOND LESSON Matthew 10.16-22 read by Jennifer Smith 'See, I am sending you out like sheep into the midst of wolves; so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves. <sup>17</sup>Beware of them, for they will hand you over to councils and flog you in their synagogues; <sup>18</sup>and you will be dragged before

governors and kings because of me, as a testimony to them and the Gentiles. <sup>19</sup>When they hand you over, do not worry about how you are to speak or what you are to say; for what you are to say will be given to you at that time; <sup>20</sup> for it is not you who speak, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you. 21 Brother will betray brother to death, and a father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death; <sup>22</sup> and you will be hated by all because of my name. But the one who endures to the end will be saved.

The Vicar Writes We can easily fall into the trap of seeing sin as "breaking the rules" - a violation of regulations. But as Jesus rage in the temple makes clear, what is really happening in sin is a breakdown of relationship, a violation of trust, and a personal wound. The temple, meant to be a place of encounter, drawing



close to the divine, has become a mere market place, and this is painful. Sin is not a technical, legal matter, sin is personal, and it hurts, both God and us.
